THE CURRICULUM

At Helsby Hillside, we have begun a journey of development that will see the creation of a bespoke, cohesive curriculum for our children, reflective of our community whilst steeped in knowledge, offering our children opportunities to enrich and deepen their understanding of the world. In addition to this, we value children's character education and facilitate this through our personal development curriculum and the non-curricular opportunities provided. We ensure that both our academic and personal curriculums are inclusive and, where necessary, tailored for children with additional needs.

Our aim is for children to acquire and assimilate new knowledge as they move through school via a curriculum journey that is coherently sequenced and ambitious. Our individual subject curriculums will be rich in substantive knowledge whilst also embracing the individuality of each subject through the teaching of disciplinary knowledge. Experiential knowledge is also an important part of our curriculum and is delivered through practical classroom experiences, school trips, residentials and visiting workshops.

By the time our children leave us, they are well-equipped with what they need to continue to be successful in life. We see this as not only serving the purpose of being secondary school ready, but ready to become active, responsible citizens in our community.





Special Educational Needs

Children with special educational needs and/or disabilities (SEND) are given as much extra attention as possible. A member of staff is responsible for co-ordinating provision for special needs throughout the school and regular meetings with all the staff are held to review and ensure that the resources available are used to the best advantage of the pupils and staff. Parents are consulted at all times.

Those children registered as having a special educational need will have Individual Education Programmes (IEPs) written to identify actions being taken by the school. These IEPs will be reviewed bi-annually with parents at meetings held to discuss progress.





Admission to School

All applications for children starting school in Reception should be submitted to Cheshire West and Chester Local Authority and are determined centrally according to schools published admission numbers and the authority's oversubscription criteria.

Our school has an admission limit at 30 children in each age group at KS1. The governors have agreed a limit of 32 in KS2.

Applications for in-year admissions/transfers are submitted and considered directly by the school in accordance with the published admission numbers and oversubscription criteria. For further information please visit

Starting School

To ease the transition from pre-school to Reception, a successful arrangement is in operation. We will organise an induction day when the children will be able to spend time in the Reception classroom and experience what school is like.

An evening meeting will be held in advance of the induction sessions to give new parents all relevant information.

Reception children are admitted in September.

Parental Involvement

At Hillside we firmly believe that the relationship between the parents and the school is crucial if the child's education is to benefit fully. The teaching staff and the parents are partners ensuring that the child obtains only the best that the resources available can provide. Parents are encouraged, if circumstances allow, to help in the classroom and they are welcome on educational visits.

Extra-Curricular Activities

The school maintains a range of extra-curricular activities. Some are provided by school teaching staff and others by external providers. These include Running Club, Football, Cricket, Dodgeball, Cookery, Choir, Street Dance, Cross-Country, Netball and Basketball.

The school is involved in inter-school competitions for a wide range of events, including basketball, football, cricket, rugby, netball, cross-country, orienteering and athletics.

We are also involved in a range of musical activities and our school choir and band play regularly in the community.





We provide wrap around care at our Link Club provision, all children receive a healthy snack and fun and engaging activites including craft, free play and games.
