



Children will be able to:		
Speaking and Listening	Listen and respond Build vocabulary Give well-structured descriptions, explanations and narratives Participate in discussions, presentations, performances, role play, improvisations and debates	
Reading	Discuss the sequence of events in books and how items of information are related Make inferences on the basis of what is being said and done Answer and ask questions Predict what might happen on the basis of what has been read so far Participate in discussion about books, poems and other works Explain and discuss their understanding of books, poems and other material	
Writing	Use subordination (because) and co-ordination (and) Use expanded noun phrases to describe and specify Plan or say out loud what is going to be written about Use punctuation correctly - full stops, capital letters	
Spelling	As well as revising and consolidating previous grapheme-phoneme correspondences (GPCs) and learning statutory new GPCs for Y2, Pupils will/Will be able to: Begin to spell some common homophones Spell more words with contracted forms (eg can't for cannot) Use the singular form for the possessive apostrophe (eg. the girl's book)	

Handwriting	Distinguish between homophones and near homophones (eg there/their/they're) Add the suffixes –ment, -ness, -ful, -less, -ly to be able to spell longer words Spell words ending in -tion By the end of the year pupils will/Will be able to: Form letters of the correct size relative to one another (tall, small letters, capital letters etc) Use some of the diagonal and horizontal strokes needed to join letters and understand which letters are best left unjoined Use spacing between words that reflect the size of the letters
Writing Outcome	Fiction: story with focus on characters Greater Depth - Story about two independently invented contrasting characters who swap places
