Coronavirus Update

The need to have a confirmatory PCR test following a positive LFD test has been temporarily suspended

On Wednesday, the UK Health Security Agency announced that from 11 January **asymptomatic people in England who test positive for coronavirus (COVID-19) on a lateral flow device (LFD) test no longer need to get a confirmatory PCR test**. Their isolation period can start immediately following their positive LFD test result. These individuals should still report their test results on <u>GOV.UK</u>.

This is a temporary measure while coronavirus rates remain high across the UK. Whilst levels of coronavirus are high, the government has said that the vast majority of people with positive LFD test results can be confident that they have coronavirus.

LFD tests should only be taken by people who do not have

coronavirus symptoms. Anyone who develops symptoms should self-isolate and take a PCR test. They must self-isolate if they get a positive test result, even if they have had a recent negative LFD test – these rules have not changed.

The self-isolation period for people with coronavirus has been cut from 10 to 7 days if they have a negative test.

Individuals who have tested positive for coronavirus can end self-isolation after 7 days instead of 10 days if they have negative LFD test results on days 6 and 7. This applies to all people regardless of their age or vaccination status.

The two LFD tests need to be taken 24 hours apart and the first test should not be taken before the sixth day.

People should only end their self-isolation period before 10 days if both tests are negative and they do not have a high temperature. People who end their self-isolation before 10 days are still advised to remain cautious, limiting contact with vulnerable people, not visiting crowded or poorly ventilated spaces, and working from home.
