Congratulations to Thea (Y1) who was awarded a special football trophy last week.




It is great to see girls and boys taking part in and enjoying sports outside of school as well as in school. This week we learnt how keeping active also helps our mental health.

### Coronavirus Reminder

Reminder that from Monday 17 January, people who are self-isolating with COVID-19 have the option to reduce their isolation period after 5 full days if they test negative with a lateral flow device (LFD) test on both day 5 and day 6 and they do not have a temperature. For example, if they test negative on the morning of day 5 and the morning of day 6, they can return to school immediately on day 6. **Please remember to notify us of having the two negative LFTs when your child returns to school.**
