### FOH Disco

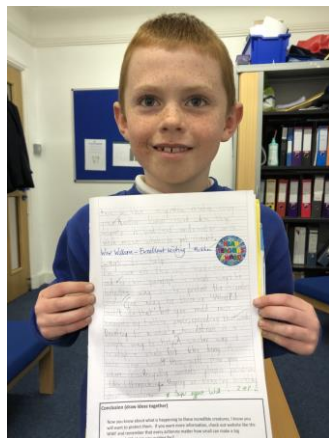
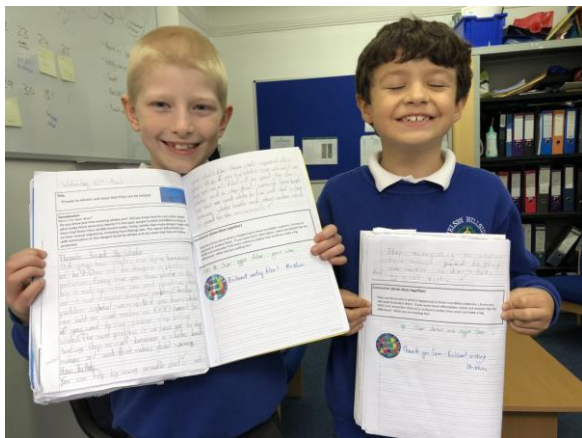
After having to postpone the annual Easter FOH Disco, the children had a great time on Thursday. Thanks FOH for your continued fundraising.
